Keeping Well this Winter

The flu season is upon us early and we've vaccinated eligible patients so far and we still have plenty of flu jabs to give. So, if you are 65 or older, or you are in an 'at risk group' (with a longstanding medical condition such as diabetes, heart or lung disease at any age), aged over 50 or you are a carer and have not yet had your seasonal flu jab, please ask at reception or make an appointment with the nurse in the flu clinic. We are also offering flu immunisation to children aged 2 and 3. They have a nasal flu spray which is very well tolerated. Older primary school children will have been offered this vaccine at school. very high, you have a long-term medical condition or a weakened immune system (e.g. you are having chemotherapy), you are concerned about your child's symptoms.

Flu Vaccinations

The NHS is asking everyone who is at risk of being affected by flu to get vaccinated this winter. By having the flu vaccination, you will help protect yourself and others from what can be a severe, and sometimes fatal, illness which could lead to hospital treatment. You will also be helping to protect the NHS from coming under pressure this winter.

Vaccinating your child

Polio Booster

The NHS is inviting children aged 1 to 9 in your borough to receive a vaccine against polio. For some children this will be an additional booster dose if they are already up to date with their routine vaccinations, in others who are not up to date it will be a catchup dose. Traces of poliovirus have been found in sewage in some London boroughs—the vaccine will boost your child's protection. Polio can be very serious and in unvaccinated people can on rare occasions cause paralysis.

You will be contacted by the NHS to book a vaccination appointment for your child once they become eligible.

NHS Bowel Cancer screening.

The NHS offer's Bowel cancer testing kits to anyone over the age of 60. You can find further information here.
